The sample size for the survey is 500 likely voters in Pennsylvania and the margin of error is +/-4.4%. Responses were gathered through landline interviews conducted through Interactive Voice Response. The survey was commissioned, paid for and conducted September 21-22, 2016 by Harper Polling. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
