METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 710 likely Republican voters and the margin of error is +/-3.68%. The Interactive Voice Response (IVR) automated telephone survey was conducted December 17-18, 2013 by Harper Polling. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
