METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 493 likely Republican primary voters in Kentucky and the margin of error is +/- 4.41%. Responses were gathered through land line interviews conducted using Interactive Voice Response (IVR). The survey was conducted April 23-25, 2015 by Harper Polling. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
